

#### [Competition rules]

The Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events (Valid from 1 January 2014) and the Guidelines for World Ranking Events (WRE) (2012 Edition) are applied to the WRE event (M21E & W21E). To public classes (non WRE), the Competition Rules of JOA are applied.

#### [Embargoed area]

Competitors are not allowed to enter the area shown in the map below:



#### [Terrain profile]

This terrain is located in undeveloped woodland near populated area in Okazaki city. Detailed ridge and re-entrants are well developed. Height difference of ridge/valley is not large but slopes are relatively steep. The altitude is between 100 m to 250 m. Half of the area consists of natural forests and cultivated land is very few.

Running possibly: Good (40%) / Ordinary (40%) / Poor (20%)

#### [Climate]

The average maximum temperature of this district is around 14 c degree, and minimum temperature is 3 c degree.

#### [Instruction for the wear]

There is no restriction of competition clothes and shoes. However, the organizer recommends full leg and arm cover clothing depending on the temperature and weather.

#### [Maps]

Orienteering Maps (JSOM 2007; confirming to the requirements of ISOM2000).

Map scale for WRE class is 1:15,000 and contour interval will be 5 m. 1:10,000 map scale may be used for non-WRE classes. Maps will be printed by ink jet printers, enclosed within a plastic bag.
