1. General Information

[Access to the event venue]

By Train and Bus

The nearest station is Nihonmatsu Station (JR Tohoku Line.)

From Nihonmatsu Station, take Fukushima Kotsu Bus (to Shiozawa Onsen) and off at Omote bus stop (20 minutes from Nihonmatsu Station). The venue is 10 minute walk from Omote bus stop.

[Competition rules]

The Competition Rules for IOF Foot Orienteering Events (Valid from 1 January 2014) and the Guidelines for World Ranking Events (WRE) (2012 Edition) are applied to the WRE event (M21E & W21E). To public classes (non WRE), the Competition Rules of JOA are applied.

[Embargoed area]

Competitors are not allowed to enter the surrounding area of Siroyama Gymnasiun until the event ends, for the purposes related to orienteering. Those who are not followed this restriction will be disqualified. Please note that major roads to Kasumigajyo Park and Shiroyama Gymnasium, as well as Nihonmatsu-Shiozawa road, are accessible as exceptions.

[Terrain profile]

This terrain is located in the east skirt of Adatara mountain, in the hilly area fairly close to Nihonmatsu city centre. This area includes Nihonmatsu Castle remains. Among a couple of large ridge lines spreading from the east to the west, cultivated lands can be seen. Altitude difference in this terrain is about 150 metre.

[Training opportunity]

No training opportunity will be offered for the event. However, a local event will be held in Dake Onsen, (Nihonmatsu city) on Saturday, March 28,

[Instruction for the wear]

There is no restriction of competition clothes and shoes. However, the organizer recommends full leg and arm cover clothing depending on the temperature and weather.

Orienteering Maps (JSOM 2007).

Map scale for WRE class is 1:15,000 and contour interval will be 5 m. 1:10,000 map scale may be used for non-WRE classes. Maps will be printed by ink jet printers, enclosed within a plastic bag.
